What is Risk Behavior?

Risky behavior is frequently linked solely to negative activities like substance abuse or criminal acts. Nevertheless, risk-taking can also lead to beneficial results, such as:



Meet new people and expand your network of friends



Start a challenging **new business or project**



Participate in academic or sports competitions

How Adults Can Help

Youth will still take risks. So, encourage them to **take safe and prosocial risks**, such as:



Volunteering in social activities



Try to join a sports team or take part in extracurricular activities



Become a class committee or perform in school events



Prosocial Risk Taking (PSRT)

PRPS is a risk-taking action taken to help others. Main characteristics of PRPS are:




1. Aims to help others without personal gain



2. Involves personal costs or risks, whether social, emotional or physical



Risk Taking in Learning



There are those who are in the area close to the circle and those who are away from the circle. Those in the first category are more sensitive to social inputs and can be influenced to behave according to the other category.



- Not concerned with the surrounding situation




Illustrative Scenario: The Class is Noisy While the Teacher is Teaching

ASRT, Participates in chatting, even at the risk of being reprimanded by the teacher

IB, Don't care and keep quiet

Reprimanding a noisy friend, despite the risk of being mocked

High


EB, Upset because the teacher was distracted, but kept quiet

Illustrative Scenario: Friends Spread Rumours

ASRT, Participate in spreading rumours, even though you may get caught

IB, Don't care about the rumours



PSRT, Ask friends to stop gossiping, even though they may be ostracized

Prososial


EB, Feel uncomfortable but not daring to reprimand

Illustrative Scenario: Friends Spread Rumours

PRAS, Blaming friends to avoid punishment

PA, Don't care and hope the problem will be solved quickly
