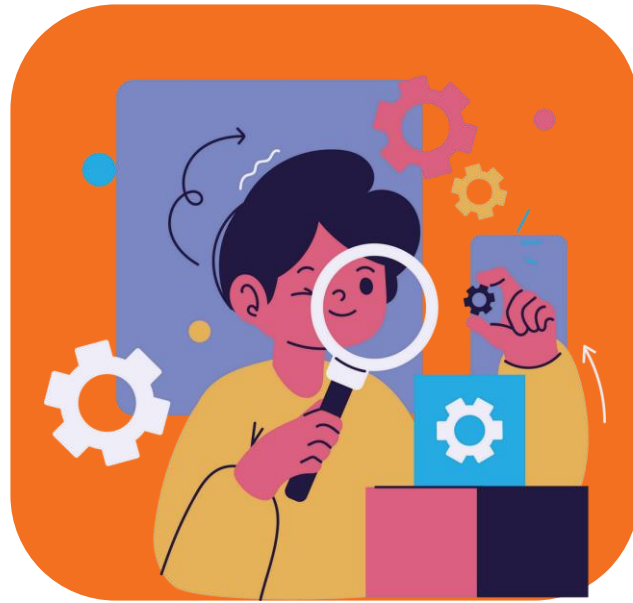

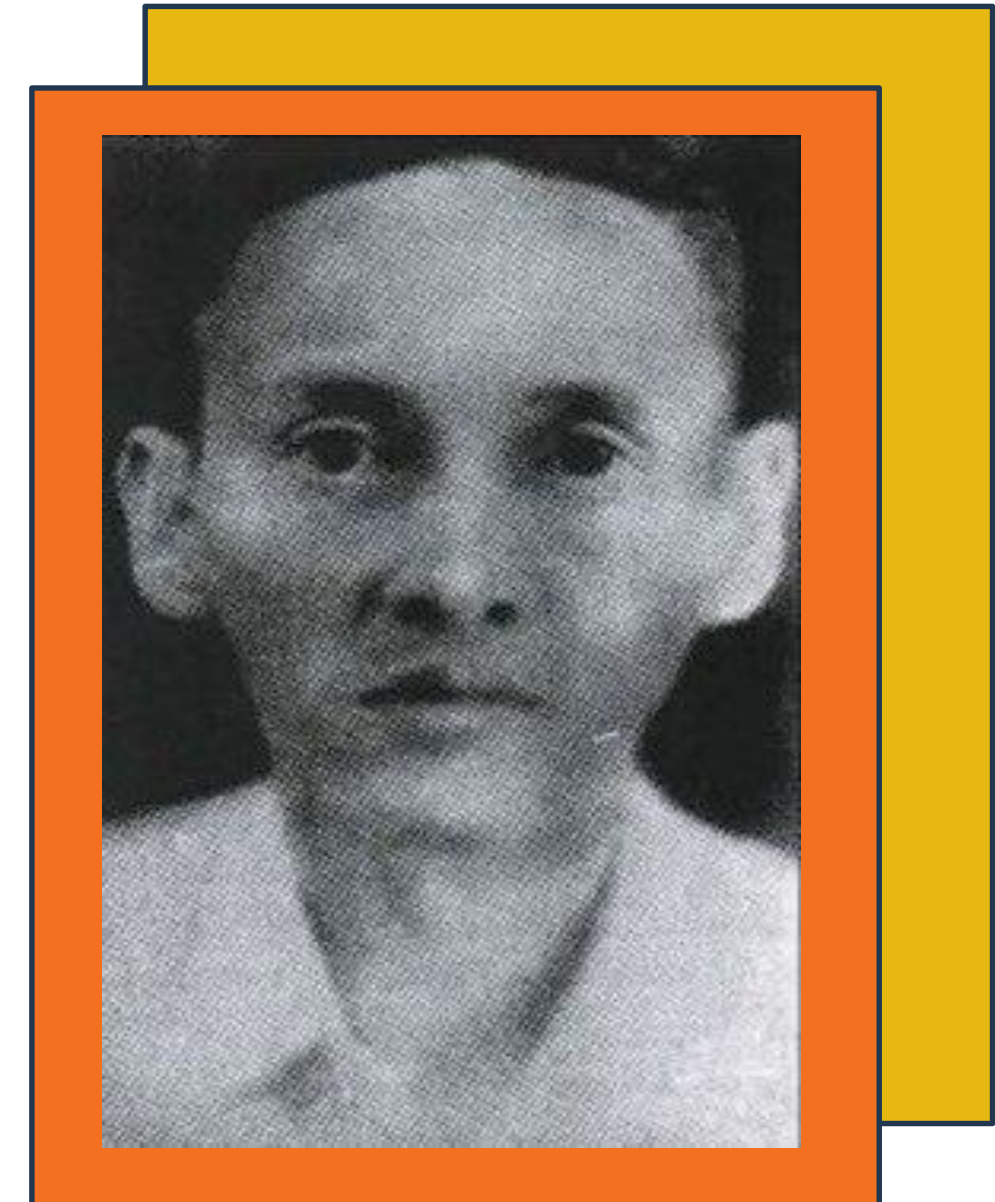

# What is Tolerance?

“The nature or attitude of tolerating (appreciating, allowing, permitting) opinions, views, beliefs, habits, behaviors and so on that are different from those of others.”

# Intolerance

“The lack of tolerance that leads to discriminatory attitudes toward others.”

~The Great Dictionary of Indonesia Language (KBBI)



Discrimination is limitation or exclusion on the basis of differences that reduce or eliminate human rights in various aspects of life.

~Law no. 39 of 1999 on Human Rights,  
article 1 paragraph 3



# Examples of attitudes and behaviors of tolerance in diversity

# What is Anti-Violence?



Attitudes and behaviors that reject all forms of physical and psychological violence that can cause suffering or misery.



# Definition of violence (Law No. 35 of 2014)



Any act that causes physical, psychological, sexual suffering or neglect, including threats and coercion.
