

Definition of Gender Stereotypes

It is the assignment of certain attributes, characteristics, or roles based on gender identity.

Forms of Gender Stereotypes



Personality: Men are considered more logical & assertive, while women are more emotional & nurturing.



Domestic chores:
Women are expected to cook & take care of

children, while men do repairs.



Occupation: Women are considered suitable for social professions (nursing), while men for technical (IT).



Encouraging each individual to maximize his or her potential through equal opportunities






Forms of Gender Inclusivity
